For your information, the membership fees have been split up into their constituent parts: Table Tennis Queensland element; Table Tennis Australia element; and GST.

Social Membership Category is for players who are social or casual players at a member club. Club / Tournament membership is for players who compete in club fixtures, inter-club matches or association open tournaments. Representative membership is for players who represent Queensland at Australian Championships, or Australia internationally.

Concessionary rates apply to members under 18 years, full-time students at school, university or TAFE, or pensioners in possession of a government pension card.

TTA Ratings System

In 2007, Table Tennis Australia introduced a new ratings system to be used as a tool for seeding at National Championships and to assist selectors in choosing teams to represent Australia.

A player's rating is updated based on the results of every match played, increasing for wins and decreasing for losses, based on the relative ratings of the two players involved.

All association state events will count towards the TTA Rating, however as part of that system, each State and Territory body has to nominate four events which have a higher weight and thus wins gain additional points.

For 2008, the events nominated by TTQ will be:

- State Championships
- Brisbane Open
- Rockhampton Open
- Townsville Open

Ashley was unlucky not to progress through his round robin singles group, winning two of his three matches including reversing a loss from the teams. Following the conclusion of the championships, Ashley has been ranked as World No. 12 for Class 11 (Intellectual Disability).

Australian Womens team member, Peri Campbell-Innes, was the guest speaker at the Sports Awards for Bundaberg's Shalom College in late October. As well as presenting awards and making an excellent speech, Peri put on a short table tennis demonstration with Queensland Junior champion, Billy Moorhead (a Shalom student) and

Australian Class 11 team member, Ashley Parrott. This gave the packed audience a great insight to the speed and complexity of our sport and was a highly successful promotion which also attracted television and newspaper coverage.

It is planned that Peri will again visit Bundaberg early in 2008 to participate in the Bundaberg Association's annual Junior Come & Try Nights at the start of the school year, thanks to funding through Sport and Recreation Queensland's Club Development Program.

Coach Development

Queensland now have three Level 1 Coaching Assessors: Pam Clarke, Dave Delpratt and myself, all of which have worked extremely hard and continue to improve their knowledge and skills to past on to the future generations of coaches in Queensland. Any person interested in becoming a coach should contact TTQ. We would love to hear from you and will help you to reach your potential as a coach.

Blue Cards

I would also like to remember coaches to keep their Blue Cards and First Aid Certification up to date. The Blue Card can be organised by your local club and must be renewed every two years. If you would like to do a first aid course you can either contact your local St John's Ambulance or Sports Medicine Australia.

Conferences and Seminars in 2007

This year I have had the opportunity to do a presentation and information handout to ACHPER (Australia Council for Health, Physical Education and Recreation) showing how Table Tennis can be easily integrated into school programs and mentioning some of the local success

stories in terms of schools programs. The seminar was attended by over 200 school representatives, mainly physical education teachers, so the message that table tennis has a place in schools was heard by many.

I have attended a number of sport seminars this year to improve my knowledge in a number of areas, but like most coaches ask myself in the goals set by an athlete, how can I measure whether or not the athlete is improving. One of my personal goals this year was to find out how to do this in a scientific manner. One of the main parts to measuring performance is to have a standard unchanging baseline. I hope to develop in 2008 a DVD detailing many of the straightforward exercises which can be used to determine improvement in athlete fitness or flexibility.

Video Analysis

I would encourage all coaches to use video where ever possible to review their own coaching, and athletes strokes, corrections, footwork, serves etc. The list is endless. Many times you will find that a athlete is able to correct themselves with the coach explaining and slowing down video or replaying the action. Personally, I

have found it useful to visually explain an action I would like a player to correct. If you have video footage that you like reviewed please forward it to TTQ attention to State Coaching Coordinator.

2008 Developments

One of the goals as State Coaching Coordinator for 2008 is to have a DVD library / or Downloadable file to assist coaches in many of these areas:

- Examples
- Dynamic warm-ups
- Setting Performance base lines
- Step through samples of goal setting
- Video analysis to correction strokes/actions
- Measurement of performance and flexibility
- Multi ball routines

Cairns Open 2007

The Cairns Open Tournament was a resounding success with television coverage several times over the weekend, followed up again by both channels during local newscasts at the same time on Tuesday.



Players from Germany (2), Ghana (1), Melbourne (3), Sydney (12), Townsville (22), Mackay (1), Bowen (1), Brisbane (1) and of course Peri & Claire from Wynnum, participated along with local players from Cairns.

Table Tennis Cairns wishes to thank all participants for helping to make this a wonderful tournament.

Number 1 seed Alex Fischer, a professional table tennis player from Germany, currently the highest rated player in Australia, won the Cairns Open title after defeating Australia's

number 4 female player (and Olympic hopeful) Peri Campbell-Innes from Brisbane in a hard fought final on Sunday (9th September). Both Alex and Peri played outstanding table tennis throughout the tournament.

Alex fought off an amazing display of controlled table tennis by Vivian Tan (Australia's number 3 female player) in a 7 game semi-final, whilst Peri defeated local hopeful Seiji Furuya in the second semi-final in an effective display of controlled table tennis.

By far the outstanding match of the weekend was Furuya's defeat of Paul Pinkewich, a legend in Australian table tennis, in what turned out to be a classical copybook display of attack and defence, both players showing incredible skills to the delight of spectators. Pinkewich commented after the match "Alex can really hit against chop". He went on to say he thoroughly enjoyed the tournament, going on to win both the over 40 and over 50 Men's events.

Claire Campbell-Innes won the Women's Open title after defeating a gallant challenge by veteran player Leonie Whiteford from NSW in what was yet again another classical display of attack

and defence. Claire eventually surviving a tough 6 game final after defeating German player Kristin Alisch in a tough semi-final.

Local players performed exceptionally well in the minor grades over the weekend against tough opposition from players as far away as Melbourne, Sydney and of course the perennial rivals Townsville. Eddie Lee (local club champion) winning through in the B grade event against experienced interstate rivals and young up and coming players from Townsville.

Local schoolboy Aled Hole took out the D grade singles and doubles (partnered with Jonathon Stokes from Gordonvale) in his first ever tournament event. Aled and Jonathon are both keen players and the local hopes for the future.

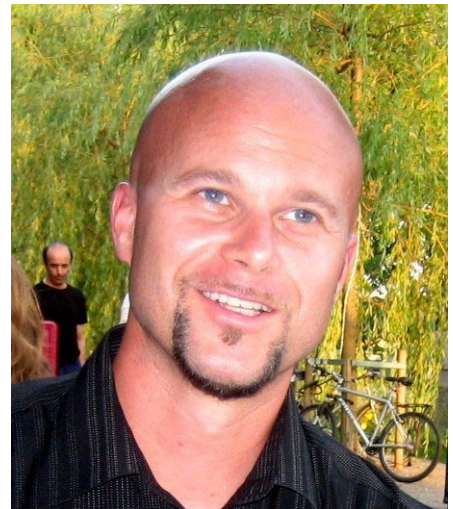


New National Coach - Marcus Gustafson

New Table Tennis Australia Head Coach Marcus Gustafson has recently started work, dedicated to significantly improving the skills of elite Australian table tennis players and coaches. Table Tennis Queensland would like to welcome Marcus to Australia and to wish him the best in his new role. To introduce Marcus, we have included his profile below:

Accomplishments as a player:

- Final Swedish Junior National Closed and winner of many national cadet, junior and a few senior tournaments
- Premier League for Sparvagen, Stockholm (doubles with Jan-Owe Waldner)
- In a training group for about five years together with 6-8 players from Swedish national team, Brazil, Holland, North Korea etc (all ranked among the top 150 in the world, incl. Jan-Owe Waldner)
- Best win: An Shu, China (quarter finalist in Chinese Closed Junior Championships). In doubles with Waldner: Kucharski, Poland (silver medal in Men's doubles, World Championships) on one occasion and Teng Yi, China (2 times bronze medal in Men's singles, World Championships) on another.



I stopped training on a regular basis at the age of 25 due to injuries, but continued to play second league matches until three years ago when I stopped completely (beat Swedish Senior National Team player Johan Axelqvist my last year).

Accomplishments as a professional coach:

- National Head Coach for Trinidad & Tobago and Barbados for 2 years
- Head coach / Technical director for Sparvagen, Stockholm for 5 years
- National Coach for Swedish Cadet Girls for 1 year. Helped out the Junior National Team from time to time
- In Sparvagen I was responsible for 400 players, 8 coaches, with one team in each league division (men and women, Premier League-Div.4) as the first Swedish club ever. We had:
- National team members in each category except Men's seniors (2 former members).
- Two Chinese, three Swedish and one Romanian professional players.
- Medal winners in the last two European Youth Championships plus medal winners in a number of international youth championships.

Elite News

Changes to TTQ Selection Policy

The Board of Table Tennis Queensland have over the course of 2007 reviewed the selection policy for State Teams.

At their December meeting a revised Selection Policy was approved, a copy of which is available to download from the TTQ website.

The main changes refer to eligibility for selection and exemptions and can be summarised as follows:

Eligibility

To be eligible for selection, players must:

- Be in good financial standing with TTQ and registered at level 2 or higher;
- Meet the age criteria as prescribed by TTA;
- Compete in inter-association teams and singles matches at the relevant Queensland Closed Championships;
- Compete in singles at an additional two inter-association tournaments in the past twelve months; (Note: this doesn't apply to Veterans)
- Be available to participate in the Teams Event at the relevant Australian Championships.

Exemptions

Valid Reasons for Exemptions include:

- Representing Australia;
- Serious illness or injury if sustained over an extended period of time;
- Participation in a national table tennis development program;
- Examinations scheduled during the relevant state championships;
- Death in the immediate family;
- Catastrophic act of nature.

For the avoidance of doubt, requests for dispensation will not be granted in the following circumstances:

- Work or study commitments, except examinations as noted above;
- Family, friends or personal celebrations, including birthdays and weddings;
- A clash with another sporting or non-sporting event.

Players seeking nomination for a Queensland Team in 2008 should refer to the full Selection Policy to ensure their eligibility.

ITTF Glue Announcement

Based on a majority decision taken by the Board of Directors of the ITTF, Glues containing harmful volatile compounds are no longer approved by the ITTF effective immediately. Although it is felt by the Board of Directors that the current levels of volatile compounds in Glues used to affix rubber coverings to the table tennis blade are in very small quantities and if applied correctly in a ventilated area provide no serious health risk to the players, it is felt, however, that long term use of such glues may have negative health effects. Therefore, as of immediate effect the ITTF informs all players to cease using glues containing volatile compounds (VCs).

It is, therefore, the responsibility of each player, or his/her parents in case of minors, to cease using glues containing VCs. Any player using such glues will be doing so at his/her own risk and the ITTF will not be held responsible of any consequences or ill effects resulting from the use of such glues.

All existing ITTF approvals of glues are WITHDRAWN effective immediately. This withdrawal applies to ALL glues currently on the market. The ITTF will cease to approve any type of glue effective immediately.

However, the ITTF's current "racket testing" programme and protocols will continue, which controls the amount of VCs in a racket in order to protect the health of the players.

The ITTF will publish and circulate widely a list of available glues that are free of volatile compounds. This list will be updated regularly on the ITTF's website.

As of 1 January 2008 for ITTF Junior events, and as of 1 September 2008 for all other ITTF events, the ITTF will implement a new zero tolerance racket testing programme and protocol, using the "e-nez" and RAE instruments to ensure that all rackets used by players are VC free.

In addition, as of today, in the case that a proven severe health incident occurs and is confirmed by the medical authority recognized by the ITTF, then the ITTF would implement the new testing programme immediately (VC free) at that date (confirmation of the incident) and sanctions would be applied for failed tests. An exact legal announcement of this procedure will be made shortly by the ITTF.

The ITTF urges all parties involved, players, national associations, continental associations, manufacturers, and parents to act accordingly.

TTA Cadet Challenge

The Board of Table Tennis Australia have recently announced that the Cadet Challenge will not be held from 2008 onwards.

The reasoning behind this decision was based on the information gathered over the last few years that qualification tournaments have been detrimental to the High Performance Program and TTA feel that to achieve the long term High Performance Goals that it is necessary to not include qualification tournaments in the calendar.

Strategic Planning Weekend

On the weekend of 13th & 14th October 2007, Table Tennis Queensland held a Strategic Planning Weekend, attended by a majority of member clubs.

To encourage attendance Table Tennis Queensland fully subsidised the costs of attendance for one club representative.

The weekend was also facilitated by an external consultant to ensure balance and focus and to ensure that everyone had a fair chance to contribute.

The planning weekend followed a six step method to developing the plan:

- Review of the previous plan
- Overview of the funding landscape
- Analysis of current situation
- Establishment of broad focus areas
- Setting of priorities within focus areas
- Development of identifiable actions with targets, time-cales and responsibilities

Key Strategic Areas

Through the consultation exercise, the member clubs and board of management of TTQ identified five Key Strategic Areas for continued work during the period 2008 to 2010:

- 1 Participation
- 2 People
- 3 Development
- 4 Marketing and Promotions
- 5 Governance & Management

Sub-areas and strategies for each year were then developed for each of the three years of this plan through a variety of methods.

A funding application for Sport & Recreation Queensland was then put together based on the priorities established at the weekend.
