I must also thank the Queensland Government, Sport & Recreation for honouring our first claim by reimbursing us some \$80,000 including GST, or nearly half of the grant allocation. We are now preparing for the second one.

We are looking at the possibility of installing a fire hose instead of a costly fire hydrant and hopefully we can convince the appropriate authorities to accept this.

All this will help us to get the best finish in the new extension that we can afford at this time. I would like to thank all those members who gracefully donated their money towards this cause. We have now received the amount of \$12,000 and remind others to help if they can.

The club equally belongs to you all and now is the time to exercise your commitment to it and to the sport you love.

**SAM WAS A WINNER TO THE END
1905 — 1981**

Sam Binstead the "father" of Gold Coast Table Tennis died as he would have wanted, playing competition table tennis at the age of 76. As one of his daughters, Glenys Thompson said, 'He must have died happy. He won his last game.'

Sam was a Gold Coast pioneer in more ways than one. He was born at Upper Coomera in 1905 and worked in the area for 41 years, mostly as a timber getter but also becoming involved in bridge-building and roadworks.
