GCTTA PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

2017 has been a momentous year with our club celebrating its 50th Anniversary. Over 200 members and guests attended a function at the German Club in April. A great night was had by all. Thank you to Lukas Kozak who organised the event and all the volunteers, musicians and German Club staff who made the night so memorable.

Big Time table tennis came to the Gold Coast in July in the form of 2017 ITTF World Tour Australian Open. Through good fortune the club was able to source 200 tickets to allow club members to watch the exciting final night at the new Gold Coast Sports and Leisure Centre. What a night and what a great venue.

I would like to note the sad passing of long term member Barry Bycroft. He played fixtures at this club for as long as I can remember. Always a gentleman although he did expect four or five nets or edges to fall his way in most games he played! Our condolences to his family. Another former member, Brian Baker, also passed away suddenly. I had the privilege to room with him at my first Australian Veterans in Tasmania many years ago. He was great company. Condolences also to family and friends at South Tweed Club.

The Club's Representative players have reaped rewards for their efforts at State, National and International events. Well done to all those who participated.

A number of tournaments were successfully held at our Club – these include: the East Coast Veterans – the seventh edition thanks to Werner Borkhardt and, the Qld Open Championship was well patronised and run in conjunction with T.T.Q.

The Gold Coast Open was down on numbers this year but this was due to T.T.A. running an event on the same weekend at their Seagulls Tweed Venue. This was disappointing as our G.C. Open is a major fundraiser for us and it had been locked into the 2017 Calendar since the previous year. The Australian University Games were also an outstanding success in September. Thank you to all those who helped run all the events throughout the year, in particular Tournament Director, Lukas Kozak and Referee, Zark Roksandic.

The Club remains in a sound financial position. This is despite spending on infrastructure including air conditioning. We have taken out a loan with Bendigo Bank of almost \$75,000.00 to complete the total air conditioning to all our playing areas. A small increase in playing fees next year will help offset the loan repayments. I'm sure people would agree it is well worth it. The air conditioning works will be completed in the next few weeks.

With a further grant of \$21,000.00 from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund we were able to finally complete the car park which now surrounds the entire building. The wall above the amenities block was also completed.

The 2017 Committee have been very easy to work with. Thanks to Martin Rogers with his newsletter contribution, Matthew Jones with his help in sourcing air conditioning and financing. Charlie Voges was again outstanding with his ground maintenance, cleaning and Sunday morning rosters. Thanks to all the Committee Members without whose support the club would not function nearly as well. Agnes Herbertson continues to shine inspiring all she serves as a volunteer and veteran player – well done Agnes and thank you.

A special mention of Van and Mary Cassis for the work they do in volunteering for Rosters at short notice when really needed. Van does a marvellous job as well at Junior Squad coaching. Cathy Townsend has done an extraordinary job with her Junior Programmes and Saturday Squads. Our other coaches including Georgy De Leon and Naoya Yamamoto both did a great job with Saturday Squads when required. The private coaches who include Cathy, Georgy, Naoya, Jake Duffy, Petr Klouba and Ben Houghton have all continued to inspire and lift player standards. Thanks to you all. A special thanks also to parents who bring their children along for these coaching sessions and fixture nights. Facility manager, Lukas Kozak, continues to get the job done and the club running smoothly – well done Lukas.

Next year will be challenging for our club with the 2018 Commonwealth Games only a few months away. There will be some disruptions to Club play. Several International Teams will be using our facilities as a training venue prior to and during the Games. The club will endeavour to keep everyone informed ahead of time concerning any fixture or social play postponements. Please bear with us. I hope many members enjoy the Commonwealth Games live or certainly on their televisions. We hope when all is said and done there will be a flow on effect of new members and participants at our club. Thank you for your understanding.

Finally, thank you to all Club members for your support. Our Club is proud to have members who play at the highest level, but also social players, players with disabilities and juniors – all enjoying our improving facilities and our great game of Table Tennis.

GOLD COAST TO HOST OCEANIA TABLE TENNIS ELITE

The City of Gold Coast is set to welcome the region's best table tennis athletes when it hosts the ITTF-Oceania Senior Championships from the 15th-19th March, 2018.

The continental championships will see players competing for AU\$20,000 in prize money in Singles, Doubles and Team Events during the five-day event.

"The ITTF-Oceania Senior Championships are one of our premier events and the winning teams will represent the region in the biennial World Team Cup." – Christian HOLTZ (ITTF-Oceania Executive Officer)

The tournament will be the perfect warmup event for Oceania athletes as the Gold Coast ramps up its preparations for 2018 Gold Coast Commonwealth Games. Two days of competition will be held at Oxenford Studios, the venue for table tennis events during GC2018. Local athletes will look to capitalise on the opportunity.

"Next year, thanks to the support provided by the City of Gold Coast, ITTF-Oceania will offer a training camp following the Oceania Championships to help prepare the athletes competing in the 2018 Commonwealth Games." Christian HOLTZ (ITTF-Oceania Executive Officer)

The remaining three days of competition will be held at the Gold Coast Table Tennis Association in Molendinar, with television production for the finals.

The Gold Coast is fast becoming the epicentre of table tennis in the Oceania region. This year the city hosted the ITTF Australian Open, which provided the largest prize money purse on the ITTF World Tour, and there are hopes of even bigger events heading in to the City of Gold Coast in the future.

"Our city's reputation as a sporting events capital is growing rapidly as we continue to host events of this calibre. We look forward to welcoming some of the region's top table tennis players to our beautiful city and we hope some of them will consider extending their stay to be a part of GC2018." – Tom TATE (Gold Coast Mayor)

OVER 30 MEN STRIKE GOLD!

The 2017 National Veterans Table Tennis Championships were recently held in Mandurah, Western Australia from 7th - 14th October 2017. The event saw 415 players from across the globe compete, including a contingent of 69 Queensland players. Queensland had teams entered in the majority of age groups, ranging from Over 30 to Over 80 aged events.

The Over 30 Men's team (Lukas Kozak, Venkat Vangaveti, Stanley Chan & Mitch Connor) were the standout Queensland team, claiming Gold in the event. The team won all 7 of their ties to dominate the field. Lukas Kozak (15-0) & Mitch Connor (17-1) led the way finishing #1 & 2 in the Order of Merit respectively. In a very competitive Over 40 Men's event, the Queensland 'A' & 'B' teams finished as per their seeding's, 6th & 8th overall. Anthony Jeffress was the standout QLD performer, finishing with a record of 12 wins and 6 losses. South Australia won gold led by the strong duo of Paul Langley and Sharad Pandit.

The Over 40 Women's team fought hard throughout the event and finished in sixth place overall. Gayle D'Arcy played extremely well and finished with a 66% win ratio. The New Zealand team dominated the field to easily claim first place.

The Over 50 Men 'A' narrowly lost to Western Australia 6-3 in the bronze medal playoff match. While the 'B' team finished 11th overall. A strong team from Vietnam went undefeated to win the event.

Bernadette Mitchell (13-5) led the Over 50 Women's 'A' team to bronze, while the 'B' team were just behind them finishing fourth overall. Ruth Cordingley was the standout for the 'B' team winning 13 of her 21 matches.

The Victorian team which included stalwart Brian Berry won the Over 60 Men's teams event. While the Queenslanders battled their way to 6th place. Gold Coast local Paul Cheung was the standout performed finishing with a record of 15-12.

While the Over 60 Women finished as per their seeding in sixth place. Linda Towler (17-7) and Sisca Fran (10-8) performed well against a strong field.

John Sherriff, Thomas Samuelsson, Terry Denny & Dennis Rylatt combined in the Over 65 Men's teams event to win silver. Thomas led the way finishing with a record of 16 wins & 2 losses. Paul Pinkewich (21-0) led the NSW team to the gold medal.

The Over 70 Men's team were also on the podium after claiming bronze in their event. Martin Solomons & Allan Bruhn performed exceptionally finishing with win ratios of 80% and 75% respectively. While Mike Jenkins led the 'B' team to 5th place overall.

Harry Bligh and Ken Hay came so close to winning gold in the Over 75 Men's team event. With scores level at 2-2 in the gold medal match against Victoria, they narrowly lost the doubles rubber meaning they had to settle for silver.

Eddie Lee played very well for the 'B' team finishing with a 9-7 record.

Coral Morgan and Patricia Rodgers combined in the Over 75 Women's teams event to claim sixth place overall. The Victoria duo Pam Tait & Margaret Mulcahy won the event.

Finally John Davis (Wynnum) and Neville Newitt represented Queensland in the Over 80's team event. They finished in fourth place overall.

TTQ hits highest ever membership!

Table Tennis Queensland is pleased to announce that our highest ever recorded membership level has been reached. Membership levels surpass our previous high which was 1,840 members in 2012.

Table Tennis Queensland President, Trevor Barrett added the following comments:

‘From the outset I’d like to formally acknowledge the support the Queensland Government via the Department of National Parks, Sport and Racing provides to Table Tennis Queensland. Increasing our membership to record levels would not be possible without the support of ongoing funding through the State Development Program.

In recent years we have seen a number of clubs conduct various restructures which has resulted in a couple of clubs not affiliating, therefore a drop in members in these regions. However, with four new clubs joining Table Tennis Queensland in 2017 (North Lakes, Griffith University, Forest Lake & Underwood (EatCool)), we have bounced back in membership, and our numbers have now surpassed the previous high levels. In addition to the four new clubs, most other clubs have consolidated or improved their previous membership figures. TTQ’s push to increase the number of affiliated clubs will continue in 2018, with a number of known Table Tennis clubs yet to affiliate.

2017 has been an outstanding year for Queensland table tennis. We have achieved several significant successes at National level this year, reflecting the strength of our club system, the success of our High Performance programmes and the commitment of our players. The recent naming of our U18 Boys Team as the Queensland Junior Sporting Team of the Year at the Queensland Sports Awards is a clear recognition that Queensland table tennis teams are well and truly a force with which to be reckoned.’

Congratulations to Benjamin Gould for winning the 2017 World Junior Championships ITTF Fair Play Award. This award is in recognition of good sporting behaviour and encouraging fair play during the event.

Under 18 Boys go back to back!

The 23rd Annual Queensland Sports Awards were recently held on the 30th of November at the Brisbane Convention & Exhibition Centre.

TTQ were fortunate enough to have three finalists on the night. This included the Under 18 Boys Table Tennis Team (B Gould, M Dvorani, F Xu, B Lander & Coach G Walmsley) in the category of QLD Junior Sport Team of the Year. The Senior Men’s Table Tennis Team (J Duffy & A Lkhagvadorj) up for QLD Sport Team of the Year & Brendan Gaeta (Townsville Table Tennis) a finalist for the QLD Sport Volunteer of the Year.

Incredibly the Under 18 Boys team were named the Queensland Junior Sport Team of the Year. The 2016 Under 18 Boys team won the same award at last years QSport awards. For Table Tennis to win the award in successive years is truly an amazing achievement.

TTQ President Trevor Barrett & Doug Gould accepted the award on behalf of the team. Unfortunately the boys couldn’t make the night itself as three of them were overseas, including Benjamin Gould and Mateo Dvorani who were representing Australia at the World Junior Championships in Italy.

Our other finalists were unable to repeat the U18 Boys achievement, but it should be noted being a finalist is still an amazing achievement. Congratulations, Jake, Aagii & Brendan.

World Champion Boxer Jeff Horn took out the big award of the night, crowned the 2017 Queensland Sport Star of the Year. The inductees into the Queensland Sport Hall of Fame included, Duncan Free (Rowing), Jessicah Schipper (Swimming), Emma Sheers (Water Skiing) and Miles Stewart (Triathlon). While the 17th Legend of Queensland Sport was Jason Dunstall (AFL).

Mandurah hosts successfully Australia's biggest tournament of the year

Organised by Table Tennis Western Australia, a highly successful 2017 Australian Veteran Championships was staged recently in Mandurah from Saturday 7th to Saturday 14th October.

Located some 45 miles south of the state capital, Perth, the coastal resort attracted no less than 416 players; the highest number of competitors witnessed for any tournament on this year's Table Tennis Australia calendar.

Notably in addition players from throughout Australia taking part, competitors travelled from China, Japan, Latvia, New Zealand, the United States, Vietnam and Wales for the week-long event.

Impressively, there were no less than 55 events held with the age range starting as young as 30 years, the most senior commencing for those some half a century older at 80 years. There were plenty of opportunities to depart Mandurah with silverware.

Seven age group categories for both men and women were held (30-39 years, 40-49 years, 50-59 years, 60-64 years, 65-69 years, 70-74 years, 75-79 years, 80 years and over) with Men's Singles, Women's Singles, Men's Doubles, Women's Doubles and Mixed Doubles competitions being staged in all age groups.

Additionally, there were Men's Team events in each category; in fact it was more. In the 40-49 years and 50-59 years there were two such competitions.

Meanwhile, in the Women's Team itinerary, there were five events: 40-49 years, 50-59 years, 60-69 years, 70-74 years, 75 years and over.

Furthermore, there were several notable names on duty; in particular four players who had competed in the Men's World Cup were present.

The host nation's Paul Pinkewich won Men's Singles 65-70 years, beating compatriot James Wong in the final (3-1).

Meanwhile, Paul Langley, also from Australia in addition to New Zealand's Barry Griffiths and Khao Nguyen of the United States, were on duty in Men's Singles 40-49 years.

Somewhat surprisingly, no member of the trio secured the top prize; that distinction went to Latvia's Sandijs Vasiljevs. After accounting for Barry Griffiths at the quarter-final stage (3-0), he overcame Paul Langley in the final (3-1), the latter having beaten Khao Nguyen in the penultimate round (3-1).

Paul Pinkewich competed in the first four editions of the Men's World Cup from 1980 in Hong Kong to 1983 in Barbados; Barry Griffiths was present in 1988 in Wuhan and the following year in Nairobi. More recently Paul Langley played in 1994 in Taipei City and in 1995 in the French city of Nîmes. Next year, the 35th Australian Open Veteran Championships will held in Bendigo.

Tip of the Month

Understand and utilize spin

Spin is often a weakness for players of all skill levels. Understanding it can help you **not only counter your opponent's spin, but** use it to instantly win points or set up your next shot. Here are some basic tips on the effect spin has off of your opponents paddle:

- * Watch the logo on the ball to determine the speed of the spin; the more unclear the logo, the greater effect spin will have on your return
- * Watch the direction of your **opponent's racket when they hit the ball**; the ball will come off your paddle **in the same direction your opponent's racket moves**
- * Advanced players can be tricky with their spin – especially on serves – and can make a downspin/backspin stroke actually produce topspin


Rule of the Month

Doubles play - what's different to singles?

The service itself is exactly the same as in singles except that, rather than the ball bouncing **anywhere** on the table, it must bounce **only on the right half portion of the table for both the server and the receiver.**

The service still alternates every two points between teams, but it also alternates between players on the same team.

The other main difference for table tennis doubles rules is the order in which the players have to play.


