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#### **GET SET FOR OUR FANTASTIC FIFTY IN 2017**



FRANK HAMPSON, the lone surviving co-founder of the Gold Coast Table Tennis Association, plans to be on parade for the club's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary function in April, 2017.

A former chief of staff and deputy editor of the Gold

Coast Bulletin, where he spent 27 years, Frank now lives in retirement in Boonah, but has not lost his interest in the sport.

He, the late Sam Binstead and the late Don Newcombe were prime movers when the GCTTA came into being in 1967, after an earlier club based at Southport Showgrounds had outgrown its premises there.

English-born Frank was the first recorded winner of the Gold Coast Closed in 1970, and Don Newcombe (who helped rebuild the club's junior programme several years ago) was the inaugural Gold Coast Open winner in the same year.

Frank and his twin brother Vincent, also a journalist, came to Australia from their native Lancashire, in England's north-west, having been contemporaries of England cricketer Geoff Pullar (1935-2014), who was capped at junior level at table tennis and later played 28 Test matches and toured Australia in 1962-63.

Frank's son Glenn is a multi award-winning Bulletin photographer.

Club officials and players past and present are being tracked down across the state and beyond, an anniversary sub-committee is looking into various initiatives, and full details of the 50-year celebration programme will be unveiled in the new year.

#### Just for the record ...

A trip down memory lane for 1992, when the club celebrated its 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary, reveals:

Suncorp sponsored the Gold Coast Open, in which David Lu beat Kent Jamieson in the men's singles, and Claire Owen defeated Gail D'Arcy in the women's final.

Starters for the A grade spring fixture comp included Steve Wilks, Michael Gilbert and Victor Bohl (all still standing) and in B grade were Mick Coughlan and Agnes Herbertson

Martin Rogers, 13 – son of the club secretary (Martin snr) and treasurer (Lin) – was Queensland junior player of the year

Makoto Yoshida beat Paul Cheung in the final of the Gold Coast Closed men's singles

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#### A ROSE-COLOURED MASTERS

Mark Rose's list of firsts is growing.

First time 'the other side of 50'. First time in Division One at the Gold Coast Table Tennis Association. First Jupiters Pan Pacific Masters Games (JPPMG). And now his first games gold.

"I turned 50 in April this year so just snuck into the over 50s section for the masters games," he said.



"Table tennis has been re-introduced to the games and I only started playing competitively four years ago, so this is my first games and I am really enjoying it."

Mark won gold in singles, silver in the doubles and bronze in the teams event at the JPPMG.

The Gold Coaster is part of a growing wave of players who are re-discovering table tennis.

"Like most people I had a hit when I was a kid on a table tennis table in the garage," he recalls.

"But a few years ago I was at a party and there was a table tennis table there. I had a go, really enjoyed it and decided to see if there was a club on the Gold Coast."

Mark discovered the Gold Coast club at Molendinar, who are the sport's hosts for the masters games and also an official practice venue for table tennis for the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games.

"When I first walked in four years ago I was expecting a basic 'school hall' with a few tables, but it is a really professional set-up," he said.

"I started playing in the lowest division (Division 5), but in the season that started in September I have been promoted to Division One for the first time."

Mark said there was a 'good fun feeling' to the masters games.

"It is really good to come up against players not just from other states, but also from other countries," he said.



"I'll be back at the next masters games in 2018 for sure."

The  $10^{th}$  biennial Jupiters Pan Pacific Masters Games was held 5-13 November 2016 on the Gold Coast in Queensland, Australia.

The event showcases competition in 43 sports and is hosting

13,000 participants from Queensland, interstate and








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# 2017 EAST-COAST VETERAN TEAMS TABLE TENNIS COMPETITION

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## **Tip of the Month**

#### Maintain a good ready position

A good ready position is balanced and prepares your body to move instantly in any direction. Use it when preparing to return serves and between strokes. The basic sequence of a rally is as follows: (A) put yourself in a good ready position, (B) move to the ball with your feet, staying balanced, (C) stroke the ball, (D) return to ready position, and (E) repeat B, C, and D until the rally ends.

# <u>Train your strokes until they are</u> "automatic."

When you first learn a new skill, you use a lot of mental energy to formulate a clear mental picture of how the stroke looks and feels. Once this mental picture is relatively accurate, you should then practice that skill repeatedly until you no longer have to think about how to do it. This is your "automatic stage". Your best performance will come when you operate on "automatic" and you do not analyze your skill. You just "let it happen."

#### Rule of the Month

#### **No Hiding**

Rule 2.06.05 now states that...

"As soon as the ball has been projected, the server's free arm and hand shall be removed from the space between the ball and the net."

The main purpose of this rule is to make sure that the receiver (and the umpire) can see the ball throughout the service action.

This means that the receiver will be able to see the racket as it strikes the ball and therefore the receiver will have a much better chance of reading the spin and, therefore, returning the service.

This rule is an extension of rule 2.06.04 and was introduced to stop players from hiding the contact point of the racket on the ball ... because if your opponent can't see your racket striking the ball, he can't judge how much spin you're imparting onto the ball ... so his chances of making a good return are significantly diminished.

# Japan wins its first ever Bennelong Cup

Japan has won their first ever Hyundai Luneng Sport Bennelong Cup table tennis trophy on a dramatic final day at the Ryde Community and Sports Centre in Sydney, beating the Australian Green team to clinch the title.

Japan was the only undefeated team after the three days of competition, but had to dig deep to head off a determined challenge from the Australian Green team, who could have snatched the gold with victory.

With the match locked at 2-all, it was once again left to Trent Carter, the hero from 24 hours earlier when he helped Australia to a memorable 3-2 win over China, to try and seal the deal for the home team.

Earlier Kane Townsend and Jasmine Chao had put Australia in with a chance of gold, both winning their singles matches.

But a valiant Carter was unable to reproduce the heroics from the day before, losing to Japan's Masaki Yumitori 3-0.

The closeness of this year's Cup meant that Australia Green, after playing for the gold, had to settle for fourth place in the final standings.

China had a form reversal beating Korea 4-1 to leapfrog into second place and relegating Korea, the 2015 champions, to the bronze medal.

Australia Gold broke through for its first win of the weekend, beating Team Oceania 4-1 to seal fifth place overall, relegating Oceania to sixth.


