gossip corner

THERE is a feast of table tennis in store coming to a spanking new venue near you. In the most spectacular gathering of star power even seen on the Gold Coast, the Sports and Leisure Centre at Carrara will host the Seamaster 2017 ITTF World Tour Platinum Australian Open from July 2-7. It is one of just six Platinum World Tour events and will be headlined by two-time world champion Zhang Jike and the cream of his all-conquering team China colleagues, male and female. Veteran Vladimir Samsonov will spearhead the European challenge, and for the cream of Australian players this will be a great opportunity to audition for Commonwealth Games places at the same location.

AS A prelude to the main event, the Gold Coast Association is playing host to the Australasian Veterans Open from June 29 to July 1, with a big field expected. It's another feather in the cap for the club which has a big reputation nationally and internationally as an organisation and location suited to and capable of staging big-ticket events. Representation from across the Asia-Pacific region will be on parade for what will be one of the centre's stellar occasions this year. Team Events will be held for both male and female players in the following age categories: Over 40-49, Over 50-59, Over 60-69 and Over 70.

GET well soon shout outs go to players missing from action, among them Riley Rose and John Freame, both of whom are recovering from a broken leg! In a reminder that table tennis is a sport with a good health and fitness record, teenager Riley managed to sustain his injury while trampolining and big John was playing a supposedly social game of rugby. The upside of this medical report is that several players have returned from different procedures, among them Chris Orlowski who is now sporting the evidence of a major (and happily successful) back operation.

OTHER returns welcomed back into the playing fold include long-time member Martin Beckwith and Anna Hollingsworth, who was making impressive strides up the rankings before the arrival of son Kobe three and a half years ago. Master baker Martin has been absent for a decade because of unsympathetic shifts, but now he has a new roster with a morning start, he's picked up the bat once again. Anna, meanwhile, had been bringing Kobe along to Saturday practice with partner Damien Yep and now has just been persuaded to make a competitive return in Wednesday night fixtures. Always good to see old faces return.

WE have made comment in the past about the multicultural nature of our membership, and the latest Division Three line-up includes Prashun Upadhyay who hails from Nepal. He has been living on the Gold Coast for 15 years but only recently decided to venture into the realm of fixture play. The landlocked Himalayan nation was a kingdom when he left, and is now a democratic republic with more residents (26 million plus) than Australia. Another long-distance member from the other side of the world is Diego Espinosa, who hails from Colombia in South America. He's recovering well from recent major surgery, by the way.

DEMONSTRATING that it is possible to make your way through the ranks, Trevor Crowley is now playing in our First Division, a big effort considering that three years ago he was in the bottom grade. Trevor, who like our president Mick Coughlan first picked up the sport in his native Geelong, has made solid improvement year or year and the hard work is paying off. Incidentally Geelong's most famous sporting identity, Suns footballer Gary Ablett, is a keen table tennis player who recently (and not for the first time) dropped into the club for a hit on a Tuesday social night.

50TH ANNIVERSARY SPEECH

The original founder of the Gold Coast Table Tennis Association was Sam Binstead. As far back as the early 1950's Sam discovered table tennis and started playing at his home in Southport, on a big old kitchen table. He then formed the Gold Coast's first table tennis club, which was called Southport and District Table Tennis Association. Sam was the first President. Due to his enthusiasm the club grew too large for the small hall they were playing in and lack of a suitable venue caused a sudden decline. The Club died but not the Binstead spirit.

In 1967 he called a meeting at his house which resulted in the formation of Gold Coast Table Tennis Association. For the next 10 years or so the club flourished, under Sam's expert leadership. Looking through my first scrapbook I saw there were as many as 47 players for the Thursday night handicap competition, with a chicken prize for each table winner. Unfortunately in September 1981 Sam passed away playing the sport he loved, a fixture game that he won, at his home. He remained President till a few years before his passing.

My involvement with the Club began in September 1973 when after moving from Victoria to Queensland my late husband Barry and I first joined, playing in the old Community Hall in Marine Parade, Labrador. After about 12 months there the hall was condemned and we moved to Owen Park, Queen Street Southport, to a small hall that held only 3 tables and was cramped for room to move. Due to a big increase in players over the next few years some players were going to private homes to play their fixture matches etc. This proved unsatisfactory so we rented a second hall in Owen Park.

Around this time the name changed to Gold Coast Table Tennis Association (as it is now) and soon after in August 1984 became affiliated with Table Tennis Queensland and became an Incorporation. I was elected Treasurer in 1978 and served in that position for 12 years continuously. After retiring as treasurer I remained a Committee Member totalling almost 30 years. Barry was also a Committee Member till a few years before he passed away in 2010. Barry and I was given the honour of Life Membership of Gold Coast Table Tennis Association in 1984. I also received the Best Worker Award for 6 years from 1984 to 1990, which was the year I retired as treasurer. Our daughter Jill was also involved with the running of the club and became quite a good player as well, but had to give it up when high school came around.

After a number of moves to better premises, all of which we had to set up tables and pack away after the games, the club was in a financial situation where we were able to build our own centre, which to this day is one of the best, (if not the best) in Queensland. The centre in Herbertson Drive opened in September 1994 and in June 2010 we opened new extensions, doubling the size of the premises to hold 14 tables permanently set up. The street where the club is situated was unnamed, so we applied to council to have it named Herbertson Drive which was granted. A great honour for the Herbertson family.

I'm so privileged and proud to have been part of such a great club and association. I've been a participating and playing member for nearly 44 years and thoroughly enjoyed all those years of being involved. I still play 2 fixture nights and Friday morning social doubles. Table Tennis is a game for any age, we have had players as young as 7 or 8, and as old as 90 or over. (I'm not quite there yet!)

Just one more thing before I finish, I want to thank all those people who have made themselves my special friends over the years. I also want to thank those who have, in more recent years, made a big impact on my life and have become very special to me. You know who you are.

Tip of the Month

Keep your returns low over the net

In general, the lower over the net you place your shots, the less angle your opponent can use and the harder it is for him/her to hit it with power.

The one exception to this rule is if you use lobs, you will want to place the ball very high over the net (and as close to the end of the table as possible).

NEWGY COACHING

Rule of the Month

Touching the playing surface

Rule 2.10 also states that...

"Unless the rally is a let, a player shall score a point if an opponent's free hand touches the playing surface."

This means that if you touch the playing surface (i.e. the top of the table tennis table) with your hand which is not holding your racket whilst the ball is still in play, you lose the point.

So, if you're right handed and have your racket in your right hand, and you touch the playing surface with your left hand, you lose the point.

However, as long as you do not move the table, you can touch the table with your racket or any other part of your body without penalty.


